

## **Shipping Papers Job Aid**

DOT requires Shipping Papers for ground transport of Category A substances.<sup>1</sup> DOT does not provide a template form to use. Laboratory staff commonly use IATA's Dangerous Goods Shipper's Declaration to meet the requirements of the DOT Shipping Papers.

## **Certification Statement**

If not using an IATA Shipper's Declaration, use *one* of the following three certification statements on the shipping papers:<sup>1</sup>

- 1. This is to certify that the above-named materials are properly classified, described, packaged, marked and labeled, and are in proper condition for transportation according to the applicable regulations of the Department of Transportation.
- 2. This is to certify that the herein-named materials are properly classified, described, packaged, marked and labeled, and are in proper condition for transportation according to the applicable regulations of the Department of Transportation.
- 3. I hereby declare that the contents of this consignment are fully and accurately described above by the proper shipping name, and are classified, packaged, marked and labeled/placarded, and are in all respects in proper condition for transport according to applicable international and national governmental regulations.

SIGNATURE: May be signed manually or mechanically, including by typewriter.

**NOTE**: No declaration (certification) statement is required for a hazardous material offered for transportation by motor vehicle and transported by the shipper as a private carrier if the shipper is transporting it to the consignee without a transfer to another carrier.<sup>1</sup>

**NOTE**: Further information is required when transporting under a special permit. This course does not address special permits.
